2011 Shipwreck Photography Competition



Terms and Conditions of Entry

- 1 This competition is open to everyone excepting the Australasian Institute for Maritime Archaeology (AIMA) Executive and the competition judges.
- 2 All entries must be submitted in jpeg format with a resolution no less than 300 dpi. File size must not exceed 5 MB. Email attachments cannot exceed 5 MB.
- 3 Every image submitted must have the following file name structure:
First and surname of photographer-image number (for multiple images that are of the same site)-
name of site-State or Territory the site is in-date in ddmm2011 format. For example:
Johanna Citizen-1-SS Nord-Tasmania-20012011.jpg
- 4 To be eligible for entry images must have been taken in 2011. The January 2011 prize is the only exception where an image taken prior to 2011 will be eligible due to the short submission timeline for the January prize. Images must be of shipwrecks or other underwater cultural heritage in Australian or New Zealand waters. Eligible images include photographs in the following categories:
 - Shipwreck above water – Any image taken that includes an image of a shipwreck, or part thereof from, above the water, with or without people in the image;
 - Shipwreck underwater with divers – Any image taken that includes an image of a shipwreck, or part thereof, with divers in the picture; and
 - Shipwreck and nature – Any image taken that includes an image of a shipwreck and marine life.
 - Other underwater cultural heritage – such as planes, pier/jetty footings, fish traps and landing craft. (Note: Enhancing accepted in all categories)
- 5 There is a limit of four images per entrant in one month. No image may be entered in more than one category and no image may be re-entered in subsequent months.
- 6 One prize will be awarded in December 2011 to the best Junior (up to age 17 at time of submission) shipwreck photograph taken throughout the 2011 competition.
- 7 You must be sole author and owner of the copyright of all pictures entered. Previously published images in print media or winning entries (1st, 2nd and 3rd) from other competitions are not eligible.
- 8 Entrants must comply with the Commonwealth *Historic Shipwrecks Act 1976* and relevant State shipwreck protection legislation and not damage, interfere with or remove any part of a shipwreck or its associated artefact assemblage.
- 9 Unnecessary harm or harassment of marine life is not permitted. Any image depicting or suspected of involvement in such harm may be disqualified.
- 10 The judges appointed by the organisers will choose the winners. The judges and organiser's decision on all matters relating to the competition is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- 11 AIMA shall not be liable for any loss or damage whatsoever or howsoever arising directly or indirectly in connection with the contest.
- 12 Should the quality of entries not meet what the organisers consider to be an appropriate standard, the organisers may, in their absolute discretion, decide to not award prizes in any or all categories.
- 13 Copyright of images remains with the entrant however the entrant grants permission to AIMA and to the Commonwealth, presently represented by the Department of the Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities (DSEWPaC), for the reproduction and exhibition (with appropriate attribution) in all media (now known or hereafter created, inclusive of the internet) of all entries, including any future public display, for the promotion and publicity of AIMA and the protection and conservation of historic shipwrecks in Australia and any associated competitions.
- 14 Submission of images by email confirms that you have read, understood and accepted the Terms and Conditions of Entry as published at www.aima.iinet.net.au and www.environment.gov.au/heritage/shipwrecks and furthermore confirm that you are the lawful copyright owner of the images submitted for entry and assign the use of said images to the competition organisers in accordance with the competition Terms and Conditions of Entry.
