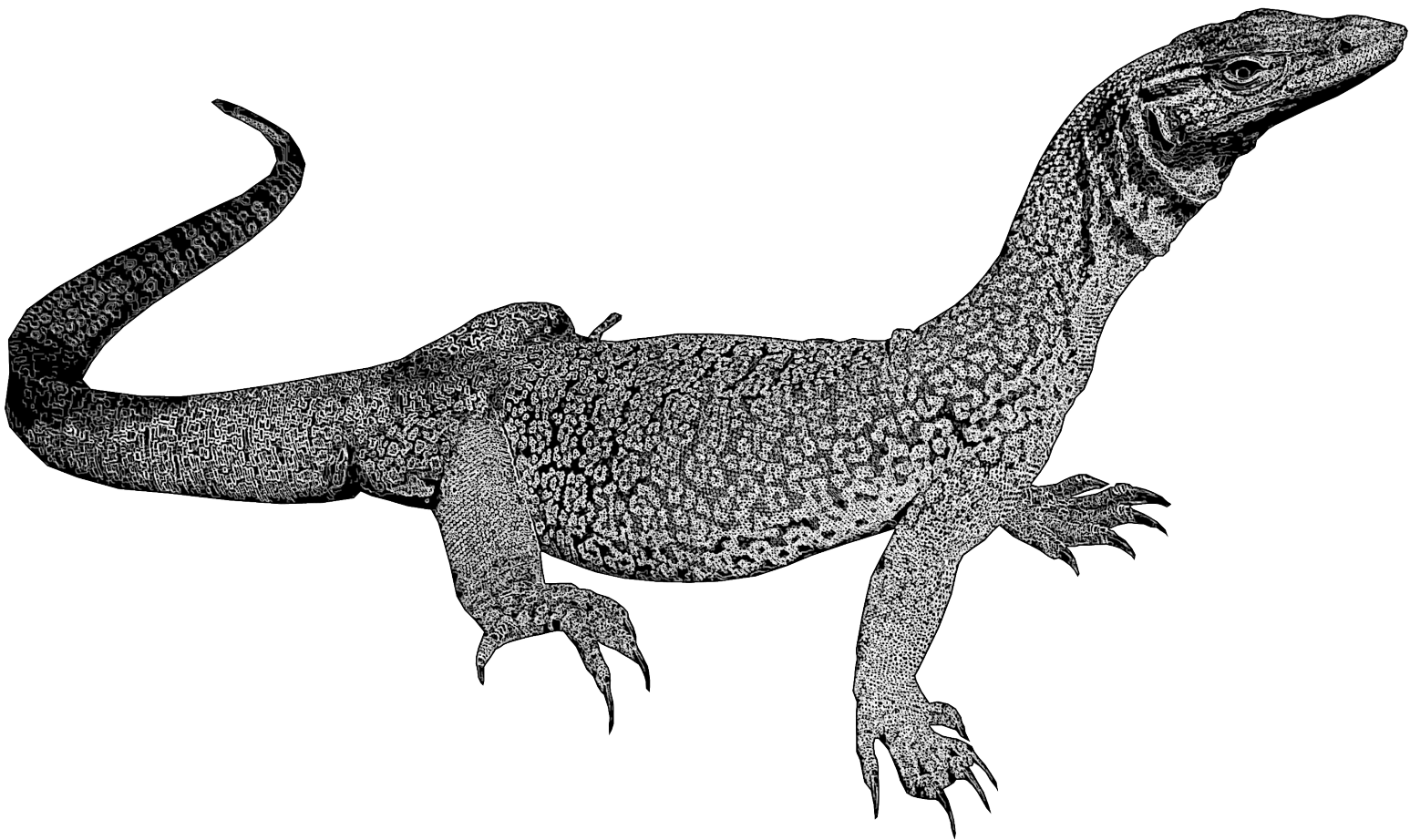

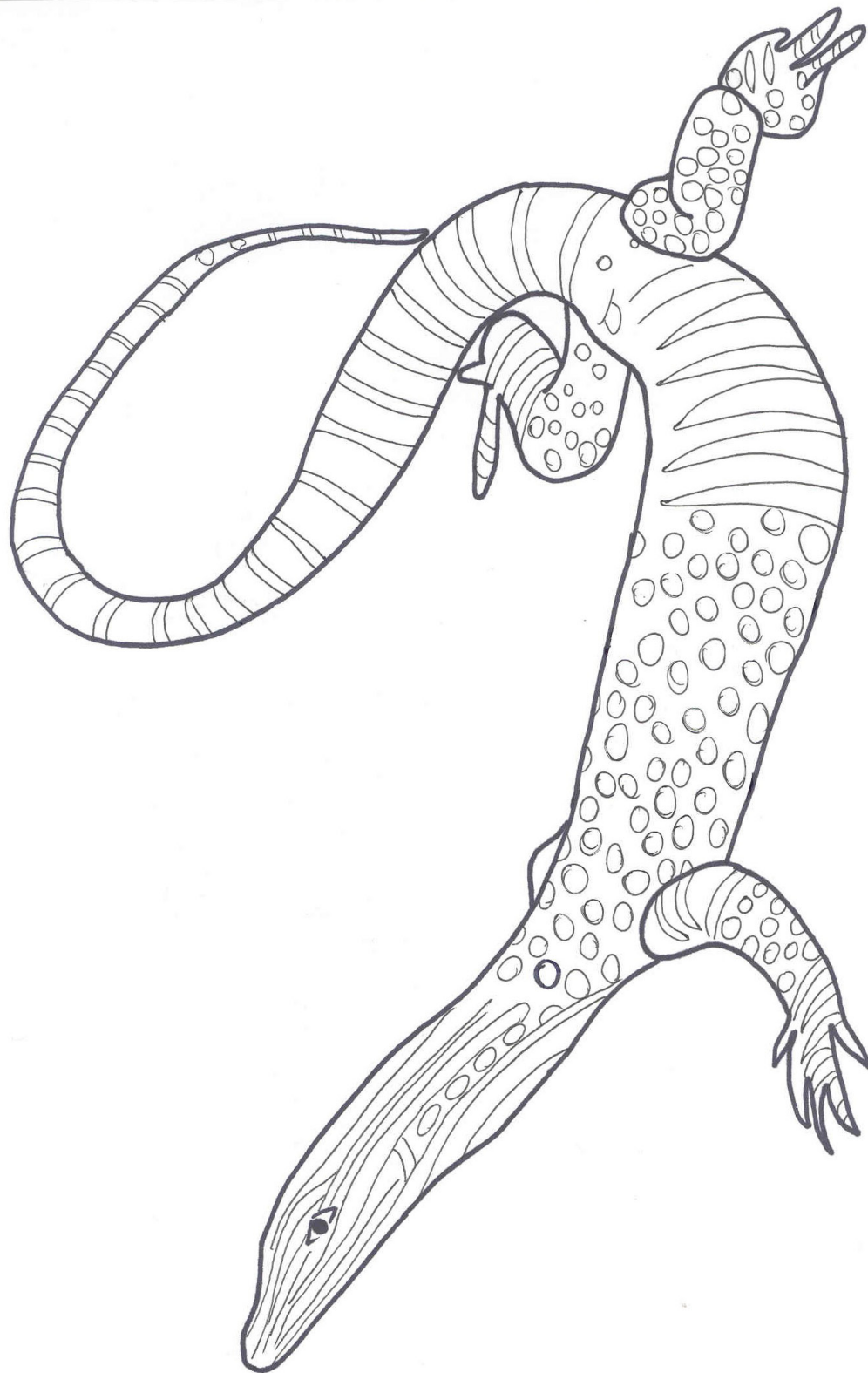

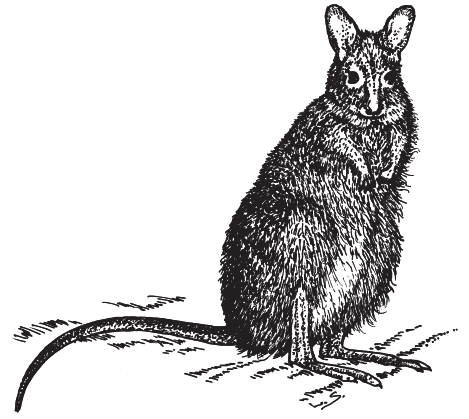

The rangers are looking after them so they don't go extinct.



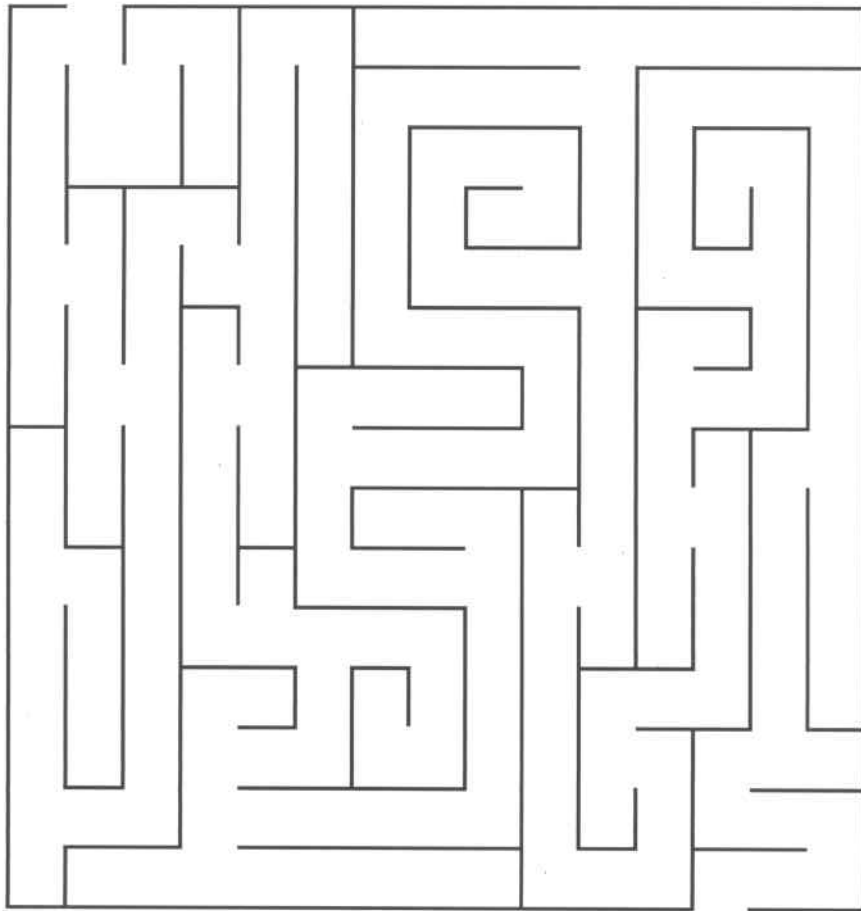


# ITJARITJARI'S MAZE

Be a tracker like *Anangu* – link the animal to its tracks.

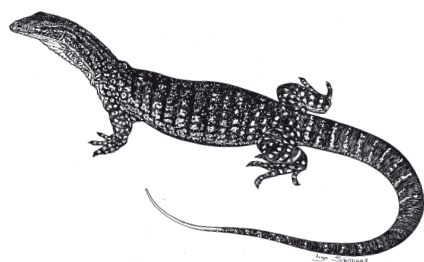
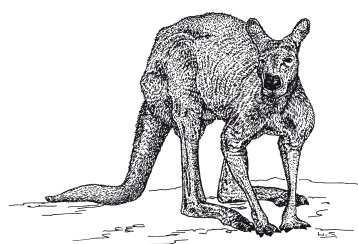
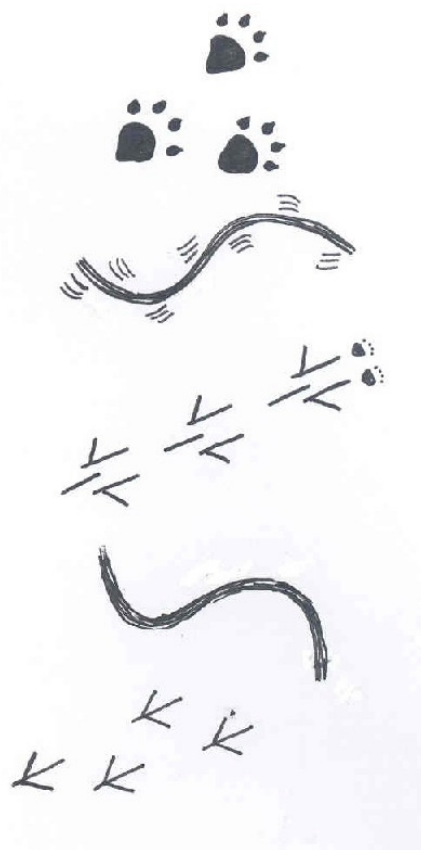

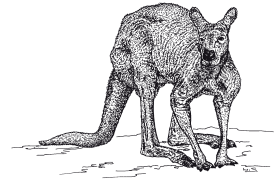


# BUSHFOODS

Can you match the words with the pictures?

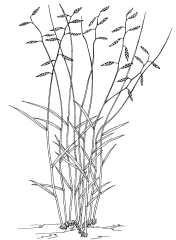
Arnguli (bush plum)
